RECRUITMENT OF CHILDREN IN ARMED CONFLICT: THE NAXALITE VIOLENCE

Children are chandeliers of diamonds dripping with prismatic lustre. A child's journey from being unborn to legitimately announcing her / his arrival and claiming the indispensable right to life, is an extraordinary one. But, every child's beginning and upbringing are not similar to another's. Financial stability draws the gap between the profligate breeding of affluent families and the vulnerable upbringing of the poverty ridden citizenry. The largest set of social losers in the world's largest democracy is none other than the innocent children who have lost their innocence, invulnerability, certainty, and cheeriness because they have been domineered into catastrophic penury. A grave violation of the Convention on the Rights of the Child (1989), the Optional Protocols to the CRC (2000/2012), the Geneva Conventions (1949), the Optional Protocols to the Geneva Conventions (1977), the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (1966), and the Rome Statute (2002), violence against children in armed conflict is an issue that prevails in ten states of India along the east coast.
